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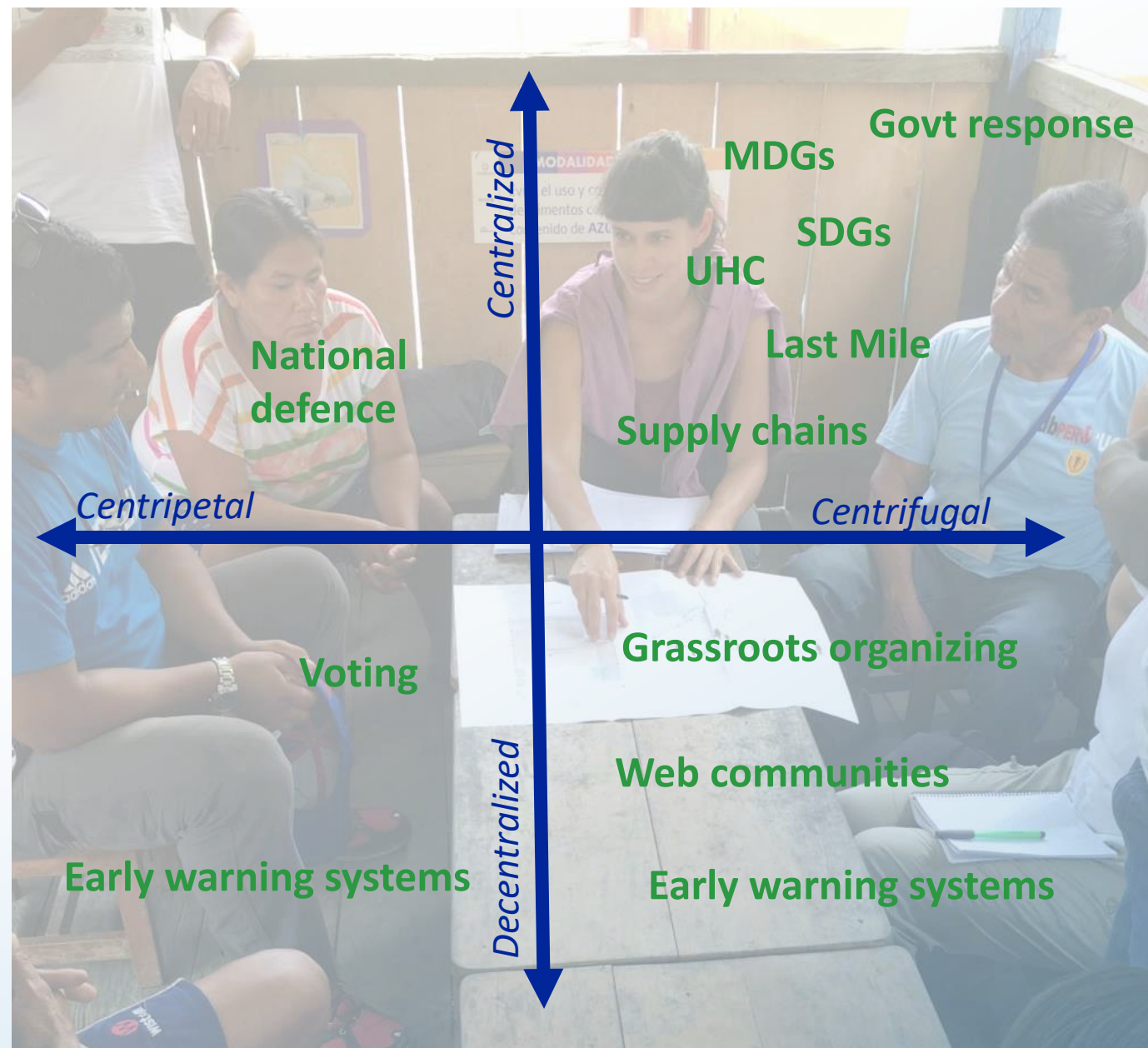
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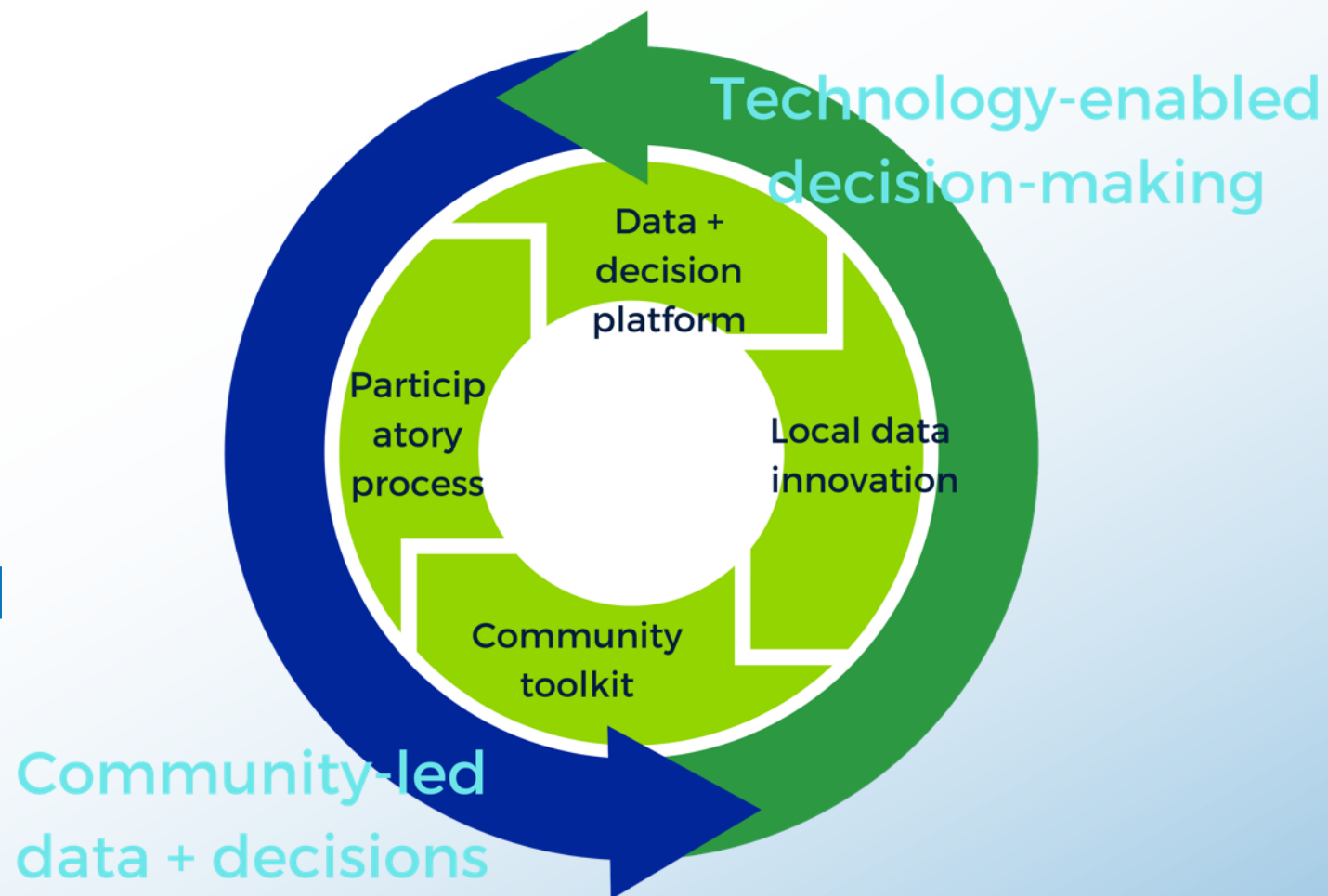


INCLUSION AND DECISION-MAKING

Entry points and action plan

- **Pattern recognition / weak pressure points**
 - Perceived importance
 - Availability
 - Agency over resource set
- **Changes to resource sets over time**
 - Importance / availability / agency
 - Stable vs. unstable
 - Depletion vs renewal
- **Inclusivity through:**
 - Participation + ownership
